John 13:31-35

(Note: this takes place at the Last Supper just after Judas has left Jesus to go and betray Him)

31 When he was gone, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man is glorified, and God is glorified in him. 32 If God is glorified in him, God will glorify the Son in himself and will glorify him at once.'

33 'My children, I will be with you only a little longer. You will look for me, and just as I told the Jews, so I tell you now: where I am going, you cannot come.'

34 'A new command I give you: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.'

Love one another. We often sing about it but what did Jesus really mean? This was not an easy, sentimental invitation. Jesus had just seen his friend Judas go out into the night, with a view to betraying him. He had loved Judas with an unselfish love but had lost him.

And this teaching was not just for the disciples so they could feel like a cosy group of followers. Loving one another in the way Jesus commanded has a powerful impact on others too. It emphasises the importance of love as a distinguishing mark of discipleship. Jesus commands his disciples to love one another, just as He has loved them, and says this love will be the primary way the world will recognise them as His followers. This passage calls for a self-sacrificing, sacrificial love that mirrors Jesus's own love for His disciples, even for those who would betray Him.

So the challenge for us is to demonstrate that love to the world in the way we speak and behave towards each other. Honest question – does the church (in its widest sense) always do that? Or do we sometimes forget that the world is watching?

Coffee cup news

Our coffee cup collection during May and June is for **Christian Aid**. It was founded by British and Irish churches in 1945 to help refugees following the Second World War.

For 80 years, Christian Aid has provided humanitarian relief and long-term development support for poor communities worldwide, while highlighting suffering, tackling injustice and championing people's rights.

Christian Aid works to help people on the basis of need, not religion, race, ethnicity or nationality, and they fund projects that help people of all faiths and none.

Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) 29th May – 8th June

TKC begins on Ascension Day and there will be a special evening service in SPP Dinton to celebrate this. Our book of prayers begins that day and you will be able to collect one at the service, or next Sunday from SJB in readiness for Ascension Day.

As in previous years, during TKC we will also be meeting in church for half an hour of prayer each evening from 30th May to 7th June. This is an informal gathering starting at 7pm. For those who are unable to attend we hope you will choose to use the prayers in the book at the same time as we are praying them in church!

Thy Kingdom Come is a worldwide ecumenical prayer movement that creates an enormous wave of prayer from small villages to big cities. Anyone and everyone can join in, so come and be part of something big this year from Ascension to Pentecost.
