Coffee Cup Collection

Our new coffee cup collection after the morning services in January and February is for the Chilterns Neuro Centre. This is a local charity based in Wendover. It has provided support to people with MS, as well as their family and carers, for almost four decades. More recently it opened up its services to people affected by Parkinsons and strokes.

The ethos of the charity is about helping people affected by life changing neurological conditions to live life to the full. It achieves this through the wide range of services it offers its 800 members ranging from physiotherapy and hydrotherapy to acupuncture and pilates. It also hosts a series of therapeutic leisure groups such as art, singing and social activities.

It costs about £1.2 million every year to run the centre or £5,000 per day. However, only 6% of that funding comes from the NHS, the rest has to be raised through trusts and foundations, donations, sponsorship or events.

Luke 3:15-17 & 21-22

15The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. 16 John answered them all, 'I baptise you with water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 17 His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire.'



21 When all the people were being baptised, Jesus was baptised too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened 22 and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: 'You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.'

We might ask ourselves why Jesus needed to be baptised? Most of those coming to John the Baptist were repenting of sins – but how does Jesus himself fit into this? We always say that he is like us in all things, except sin.

In taking on human flesh Jesus identified with us in our humanity. He had the same feelings and reactions that we have; only he never did sin or do anything wrong. Most of the time, he looked just the same as everyone else. And, when he got up in the synagogue of his home town and began to amaze people with his insight, his neighbours could not understand it. They had lived for years with him and had no idea of the divine side of his person, but he understood what it is like to live as a human.

It was at his baptism that the Spirit of God, in the visible form of a dove, came down on Jesus. It was a clear endorsement from his Father for the work that Jesus was about to begin. So, through his baptism, Jesus is being officially commissioned to begin his public work of teaching, healing, suffering, and dying for us.
