Luke 9:28-36

The Transfiguration

²⁸ About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. ²⁹ As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. ³⁰ Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendour, talking with Jesus. ³¹ They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfilment at Jerusalem.

³² Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. ³³ As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." (He did not know what he was saying.)

³⁴ While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. ³⁵ A voice came from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him." ³⁶ When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone. The disciples kept this to themselves and did not tell anyone at that time what they had seen.

Ash Wednesday is the start of Lent when we remember Jesus' forty days in the wilderness when he was unsuccessfully tempted to turn his back on God's plan. It encourages us to reflect, to turn away from sin, and recommit to God. It is marked by a cross of ashes being placed on our foreheads. We will mark Ash Wednesday at:

The new Bishop of Buckingham

Our new Bishop of Buckingham, Revd Canon Dave Bull, was consecrated in Canterbury Cathedral on Thursday alongside the new Bishop of Reading Revd Canon Mary Gregory.

A former atheist, Bishop Bull said in an interview on BBC Three Counties Radio that he realised in his mid-20s "there was something missing" in his life. He added "I believe that everyone at some point in their life explores spiritual questions and faith."

Bishop Bull studied at Worcester College, Oxford, and trained for ministry at Wycliffe Hall in the city. In 2009 he was ordained as a priest and was appointed area dean of Wycombe in 2016.
